Site Waste Management Plans

RUNNYMEDE, ASHFORD, DENHAM, EASTLEIGH, OXFORD, CRA

21 April - 14 May, 2009

The South East Centre for the Built Environment (SECBE) is running free training sessions around the region to help local authorities - and, through them, the industry - understand the environmental benefits of imposing the legally required Site Waste Management Plans for construction sites. Research carried out by SECBE showed little awareness of the requirement among both the industry and local authorities. It gained DEFRA funding to organise the free workshops to help local authorities, including all the departments likely to be involved in the development process including planning, building control, waste, health and safety and environment. The aim was to make them aware of their responsibilities - more than just as enforcers but, using their planning powers, to require a SWMP at the outset, right at the start, when the architect first designs a scheme.
